


## Study Abroad Data Office of Global Initiatives and International Programs

At Cedar Crest College, we want every student to have the chance to study abroad. We support a diverse population of students, and encourage all students to study abroad, regardless of race, ethnicity, age, religion, gender, LGBTQ status, disability or income.

56% of the class of 2020 studied abroad over their four years at Cedar Crest, compared to 10% of all US college students nationally.

Funding can be a barrier to study abroad, so every undergraduate at Cedar Crest has \$2,500 they can use to study abroad. Additionally, 82% of those who studied abroad as part of the Class of 2020 were Pell Grant recipients.


The annual Carmen Twillie Ambar Sophomore Expedition offers students an affordable global experience and creates a pathway for traditionally underrepresented students to study abroad—one of our office's central goals. The program is FREE and open to all eligible sophomores. Recent destinations include Greece, England and Brazil. Next up, the Falcons will be headed Costa Rica and Morocco. This program has enabled 361 students to study abroad for FREE.



Cedar Crest has a high and growing rate of diverse student populations participating in study abroad. The Sophomore Expedition is a key part in helping us make study abroad accessible. We are publishing here our racial/ethnic and ADA statistics. We will continue to collect and publish our data in the future for these and other protected populations.






## Racial diversity among participants on the Sophomore Expedition to London in 2020:



We work closely with the Office of Disability Resources to help students with documented disabilities or accommodations study abroad. In 2018-2019, 18.41% of Cedar Crest's study abroad participants had a disability. Of those with a documented or disclosed disability, the most common was a mental health concern.
